Necessary Qualifications:

- A veterinary degree registerable with the Veterinary Council of Ireland

Desirable Qualifications:

- A specialist qualification in veterinary pathology such as DipACVP, DipECVP or FRCPath would be highly beneficial
- Post graduate veterinary pathology training (e.g. residency) or veterinary diagnostic laboratory experience
- We will consider candidates who are still in the process of completing residency training in veterinary pathology or those without post graduate qualifications but with relevant skills in the area
- Alternatively, applicants with a minimum of 2 years' experience in equine veterinary practice with a demonstrated interest in veterinary pathology will also be considered
